That's almost criminal when a few miles away from our summer cottage are acres upon acres of vineyards producing fabulous, awardwinning wines. We scoured Long Island's vineyards (it was a hard job) to find the wines you'll be sipping all summer.

Not that you'd ever sneak wine onto the beach (**wink**), but if you were going to, these cans from Mattituck's Bridge Lane Wine would make it a snap. Sold in four-packs and available in five varietals (rosé, Chardonnay, Sauvignon Blanc, white Merlot and a red blend), each can contains about two glasses of wine.

CROTEAUX'S 2017 'SAUVAGE' MERLOT 181 ROSÉ

Tucked into Southold, Croteaux is an utterly charming little vineyard that only produces rosé. You can't go wrong with any of its wines, but for summer we're getting our hands on as many bottles of the 2017 "Sauvage" Merlot 181 rosé as we can. Made with natural yeast, this is a bright, fruity wine with a clean finish that makes it perfect with basically anything and everything you'll be eating this summer.

Its 2015 Brut is crisp with notes of lemon, apple and pear that will have you "cheers"-ing all summer long.
